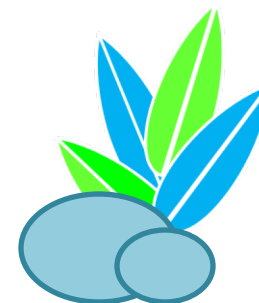

finjān

فِنْجَانٌ

Cup

The tea is in the cup.

الشَّايُ فِي الْفِنْجَانِ

Ash-shai fil-finjān

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *fin-jā-nun*

مِلْعَقَةٌ

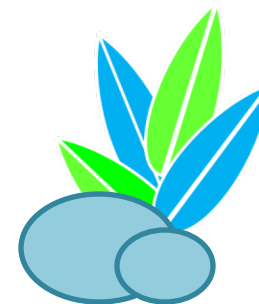
Spoon

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *mil-'a-qa-tun*

شَوْكَةٌ

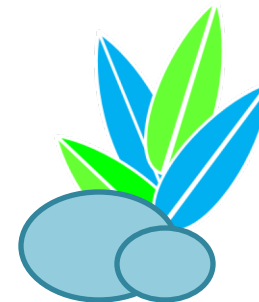
Fork

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: shau-ka-tun

سِكِّينٌ

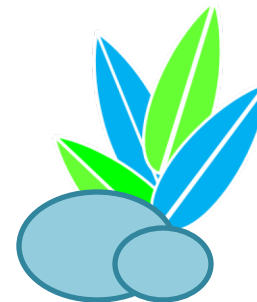
Knife

As-sikkin 'alā al-maktab

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *sik-kī-nun*

samak

سَمَكٌ

Fish

I like the fried fish.

أَنَا أُحِبُّ السَّمَكَ

الْمَقْلِيَّ

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: sa-ma-kun

Ana uhibbu as-samak al-maqliy

خَضْرَوَاتٌ

khadrawāt (khodrowāt)

Vegetables

I don't like
vegetables.

أَنَا لَا أُحِبُّ خَضْرَوَاتٍ

Ana lā uḥibbu khadrawat

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: khad-ra-wā-tun



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

عَصِيرُ الْبُرْتُقَالِ

'*asīr al-burtuqāl*

Orange juice

I drink
orange
juice

أَنَا أَشْرَبُ عَصِيرَ الْبُرْتُقَالِ

Ana ashrah 'asir al-burtuqāl

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: '*a-ṣī-rul-bur-tu-qā-li*

'asīr bi-thalj

Juice with ice

We like juice
with ice.

نَحْنُ نُحِبُّ العَصِيرَ بِالتَّلْجِ

nahnu nuhibbu al-'asir bith-thalj

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: a-sī-run bith-thal-ji

mā' sākhin

Hot water

Hot water is on
the table.

مَاءٌ سَاخِنٌ عَلَى الْمَكْتَبِ

Mā' sākhin 'alā al-maktab

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *mā-un sā-khi-nun*

mā' bārid مَاءٌ بَارِدٌ

Cold water

I want the cold water.

أَنَا أُرِيدُ الْمَاءَ الْبَارِدَ

Ana urid al-mā' al-bārid

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *mā-un bā-ri-dun*

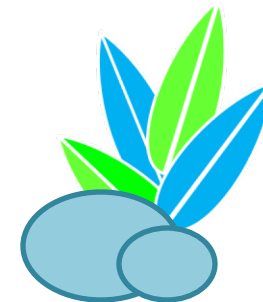

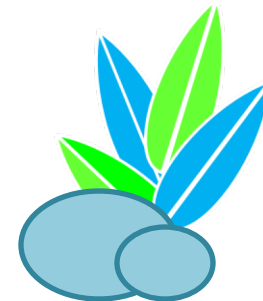

MASCULINE		
Word	Say it!	Translation
أَنَا أَذْهَبُ	<i>ana adhhab</i>	I go
أَنْتَ تَذْهَبُ	<i>anta tadhhab</i>	You go
هُوَ يَذْهَبُ	<i>huwa yadhhab</i>	He go



Grammar (an-nahwu النحْوُ)

PRESENT TENSE VERBS FOR ONE

FEMININE		
Word	Say it!	Translation
أَنَا أَذْهَبُ	ana <i>adhhab</i>	I go
أَنْتِ تَذْهَبِينَ	anti <i>tadhhabin</i>	You go
هِيَ تَذْهَبُ	hiya <i>tadhhab</i>	She go

	MASCULINE	
What is your favourite food?	<i>ma huwa ta‘ām mufaddal laka?</i>	مَا هُوَ طَعَامٌ مُفَضَّلٌ لَكَ؟
I like fried noodle.	<i>ana uhibbu al-makrūnah al-maqliyyah</i>	أَنَا أُحِبُّ الْمَكْرُونَةَ الْمَقْلِيَّةَ
I don't like bread.	<i>ana lā uhibbu al-khubz</i>	أَنَا لَا أُحِبُّ الْخُبْزَ

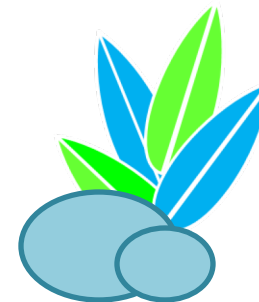

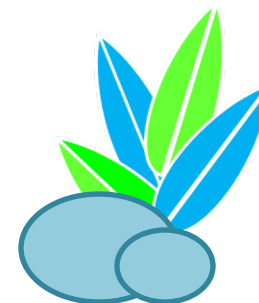

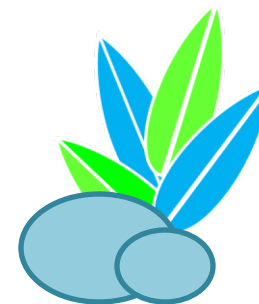

Alphabet (الْحُرُوفُ *al-hurūf*)



(ب ت ث) have same shape when you write them but their dots are not the same to differentiate each of them. The letter (ت) also has other shape when located at the end of words which is like this (ة) or this (ة) and normally this shape is used to indicate feminine words or *muannath* (مُؤَنَّث).

Find the letter (ب) within the words below and write the words nicely.

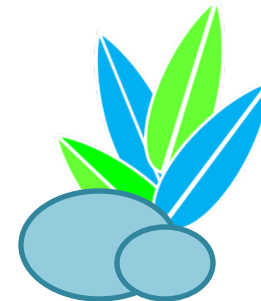
