kabīr

كَبِيرٌ

Big

My house is big.

بَيْتِي كَبِيرٌ

Baiti kabir



* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: ka-bī-run

Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

saghīr (soghīr)

صَغِيرٌ

Small

My desk is small.

مَكْتَبِي صَغِيرٌ

Maktabi saghir

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: sa-ghī-run

عِنْدِي

indī

I have / I own

I have a book.

عِنْدِي كِتَابٌ
'indi kitab



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

'indaka

عِنْدَكَ

You have (male)

Do you have a pen?

هَلْ عِنْدَكَ قَلَمٌ؟
Hal 'indaka qalam?



* Without phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: 'in-dak

Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

ghurfah

غُرْفَةٌ

Room

This is a big room.

هَذِهِ غُرْفَةٌ كَبِيرَةٌ
hādhihi ghurfah kabīrah

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *ghur-fa-tun*



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

هَاتِفٌ مَحْمُولٌ

hātif mahmūl

Mobile phone

I have a mobile phone.

عِنْدِي هَاتِفٌ مَحْمُولٌ
'indi hatif mahmul

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: hā-ti-fun mah-mū-lun



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

كُمْبِيُوتَرٌ مَحْمُولٌ

kumbiyūtar maḥmūl

Mobile computer (laptop)

كُمْبِيُوتَرٌ مَحْمُولٌ عَلَى كُرْسِيٍّ

kumbiyūtar maḥmūl 'ala kursiy

Laptop is on a chair.

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *kum-bi-yū-ta-run maḥ-mū-lun*

qurs

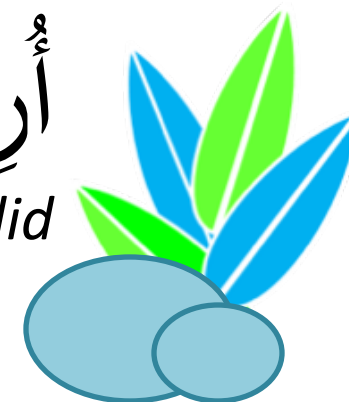
قُرْصٌ

Disk

I want the new disk.

أُرِيدُ الْقُرْصَ الْجَدِيدَ
Uridu al-qurs al-jadid

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *qur-sun*



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

hammām

حَمَّامٌ

Toilet / bathroom

My father is in the toilet.

أَبِي فِي الْحَمَّامِ
Abi fi al-hammām

* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *ham-mā-mun*



Vocabulary (المُفْرَدَاتُ *al-mufradāt*)

أَعْضَاءُ الْجِسْمِ

a'-dāul-jism (a'-dōul-jism)

Body parts

Body parts are clean.

أَعْضَاءُ الْجِسْمِ نَظِيفَةٌ
a'-dāul-jism nazifah



* With phonetic sign at the end, we pronounce it: *a'-dā-ul-jis-mi*

	<i>baituka</i>	Your house
	<i>baituhu</i>	His house

FEMININE		
Word	Say it!	Translation
بَيْتِي	<i>baitī</i>	My house
بَيْتِكَ	<i>baituki</i>	Your house
بَيْتِهَا	<i>baituhā</i>	Her house



Phrases (الْعِبَارَاتُ *al-'ibārāt*)

	MASCULINE	
Do you understand?	<i>hal fahim</i> ta ?	هَلْ فَهِمْتَ؟
Yes, I understood.	<i>na'am,</i> <i>fahim</i> tu	نَعَمْ، فَهِمْتُ
No, I don't understand.	<i>lā, lā</i> afham	لَا، لَا أَفْهَمُ
I understood a little.	<i>fahim</i> tu <i>qalīlan</i>	فَهِمْتُ قَلِيلًا



Phrases (الْعِبَارَاتُ *al-'ibārāt*)

	FEMININE	
Do you understand?	<i>hal fahimti?</i>	هَلْ فَهِمْتِ؟
Yes, I understood.	<i>na'am, fahimtu</i>	نَعَمْ، فَهِمْتُ
No, I don't understand.	<i>lā, lā afham</i>	لَا، لَا أَفْهَمُ
I understood a little.	<i>fahimtu qalīlan</i>	فَهَيْمْتُ قَلِيلًا

(2) I live in student hostel and my room is number three.

Alphabet (الْحُرُوفُ الضَّ) ص

(ب ت ث) have same shape when you write them but their dots are not the same to differentiate each of them. The letter (ت) also has other shape when located at the end of words which is like this (ة) or this (ة) and normally this shape is used to indicate feminine words or *muannath* (مُؤَنَّث).

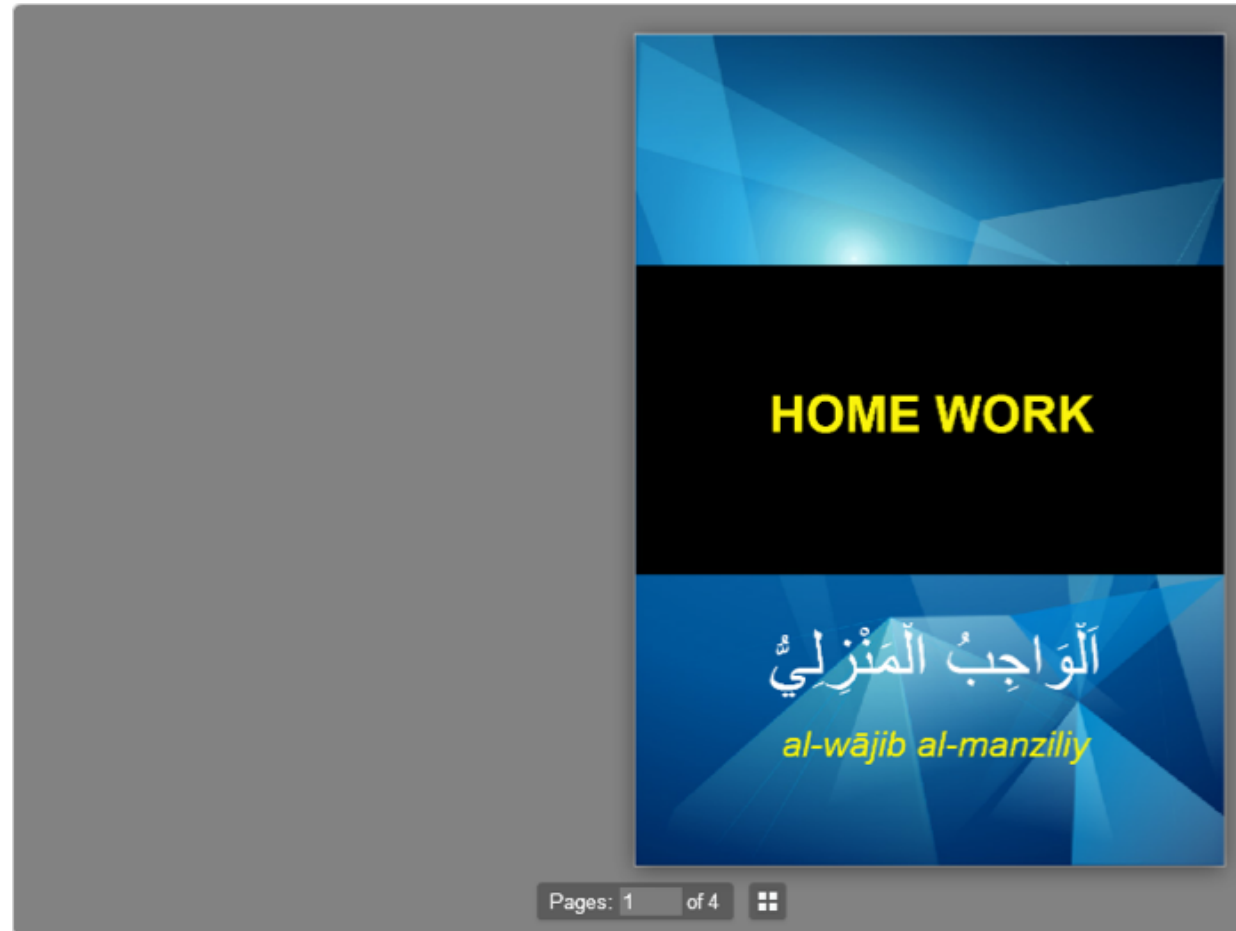


